

# Wisconsin Disaster Medical Response Team Medical Reserve Corps *Mobile Medical Care Facility*

## What is the MMCF?

The Mobile Medical Care Facility (MMCF) is a series of 4 Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) shelters when combined form a forty bed medical care center.

The facility deploys with standard medical equipment found in basic hospital settings and specialty equipment that includes burn supplies to treat 20 burn patients, pediatric emergency medical equipment and personal protective equipment for working in a chemical, biological or radiological terrorism incident.



## How do I request the MMCF?

The Mobile Medical Care Facility can be deployed during a disaster at the request of a healthcare facility or local jurisdiction to the Wisconsin Disaster Medical Response Team Medical Reserve Corps Duty Officer at 608-778-4701.

## What is it used for?

The MMCF's primary mission is to serve as a replacement for or supplement to local medical care after a disaster or during special events. For example, if a community experiences a tornado or flood which damages or overwhelms its medical care facilities, the MMCF can be deployed to the community until the local health resources are functioning normally again.

Others uses include, as a First Aid Station or a Point Of Dispensing site for mass immunizations during a public health event, a Mass Casualty Treatment Facility or an Alternate Care Site designed to provide low acuity patient care.

**\*\*The MMCF is not a long-term facility.**

**Patients should be stabilized and moved to a definitive care facility within a few hours.\*\***

## Who will staff the MMCF?

The MMCF can be staffed by the members of a requesting healthcare facility or public health department. During a surge event the MMCF can be staffed by a Type I Mobile Field Medical Team (MFMT) which is capable of providing a wide range of clinical services.

The MFMT will be made of members from the MRC and the requesting healthcare facilities staff. Additional personnel are also available through WEAVR.
