Challenges/Issues	<p>EMResource</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Thank you to everyone who is entering data daily on EMResource! One hospital was asking the question regarding the difference between “dash” and “0”. The guidance is to leave a “dash” if you don’t have that capability in your facility, for example pediatric beds. If you are getting notified from the State that information is missing, please let Aimee know as well. • Current census: 8 inpatient, 2 intubated, 23 inpatients with tests pending. • FYI: Bed capacity in MN. Some hospitals in the Metro area are seeing few ICU beds to the point where some are on divert. Please bring this to your Incident Command for situational awareness. Referrals to the Twin Cities may be limited or more difficult. Aimee has some leads. Waiting for more information regarding what is expired and what is needed. <p>Evaluating and Testing: Please continue to promote these testing sites!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are still shortages of reagents and lab testing materials. • Hospitals are seeing more nursing homes requiring negative COVID-19 tests prior to admission to the nursing homes. This is causing several patients to be kept in observation status.
