

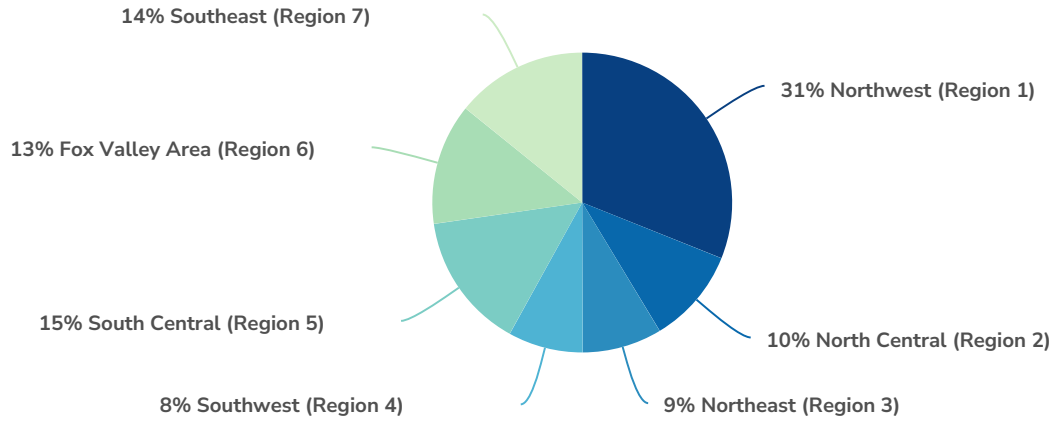

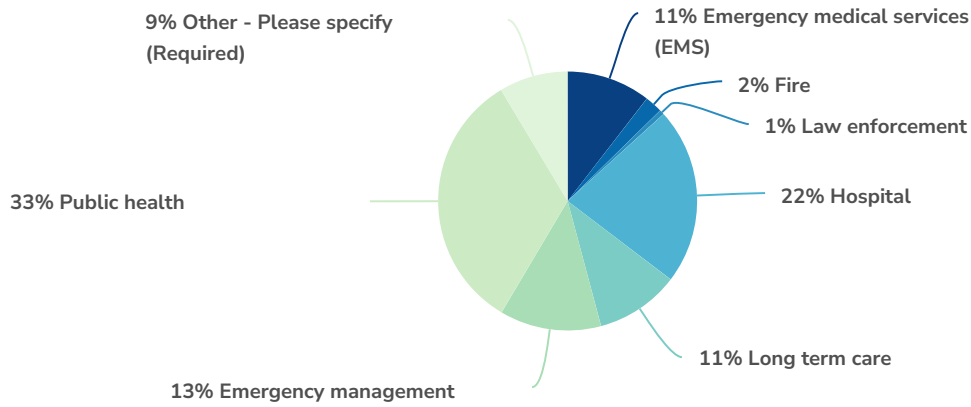
1. Which healthcare emergency readiness coalition (HERC) are you a member of?

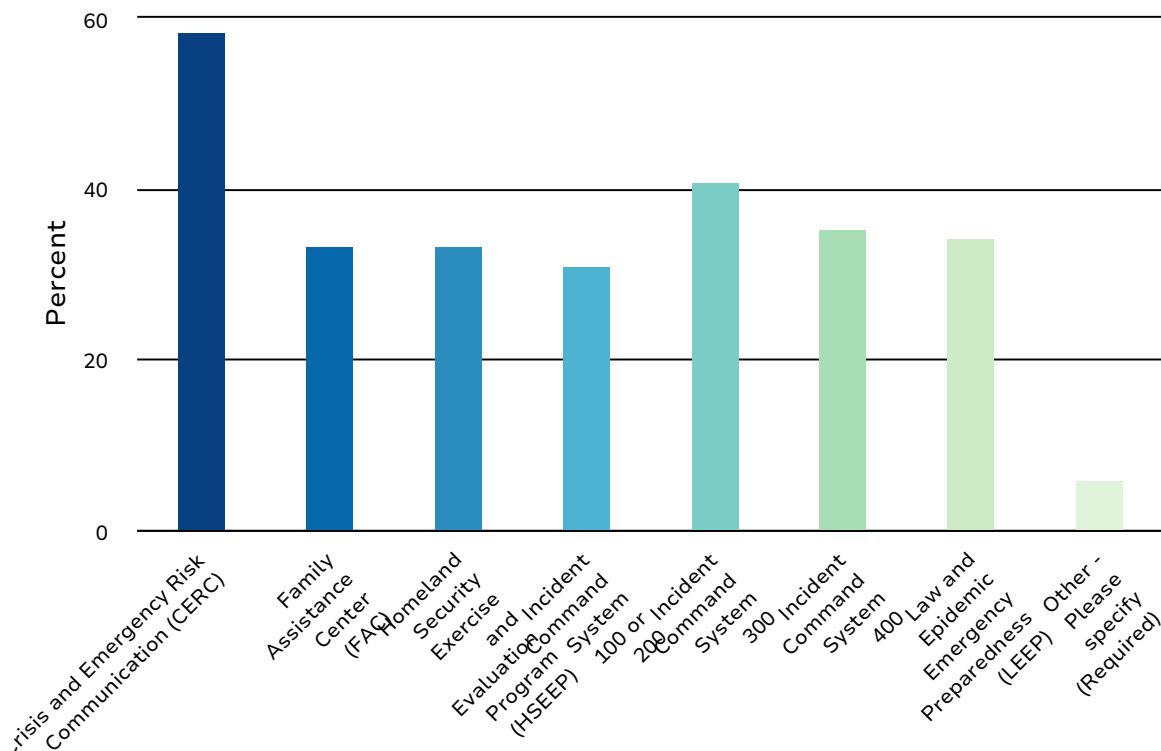
2. In which sector do you work?

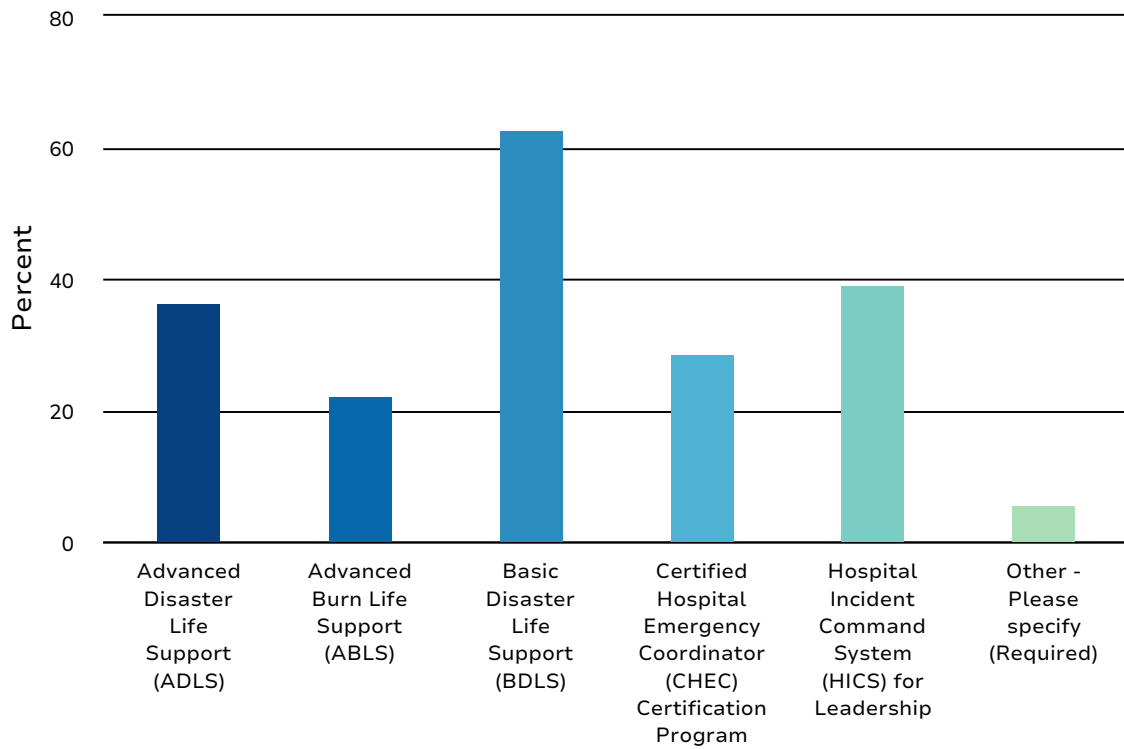

3. Which of the following general preparedness training courses would you or someone from your organization be interested in attending, if offered? Select all that apply.



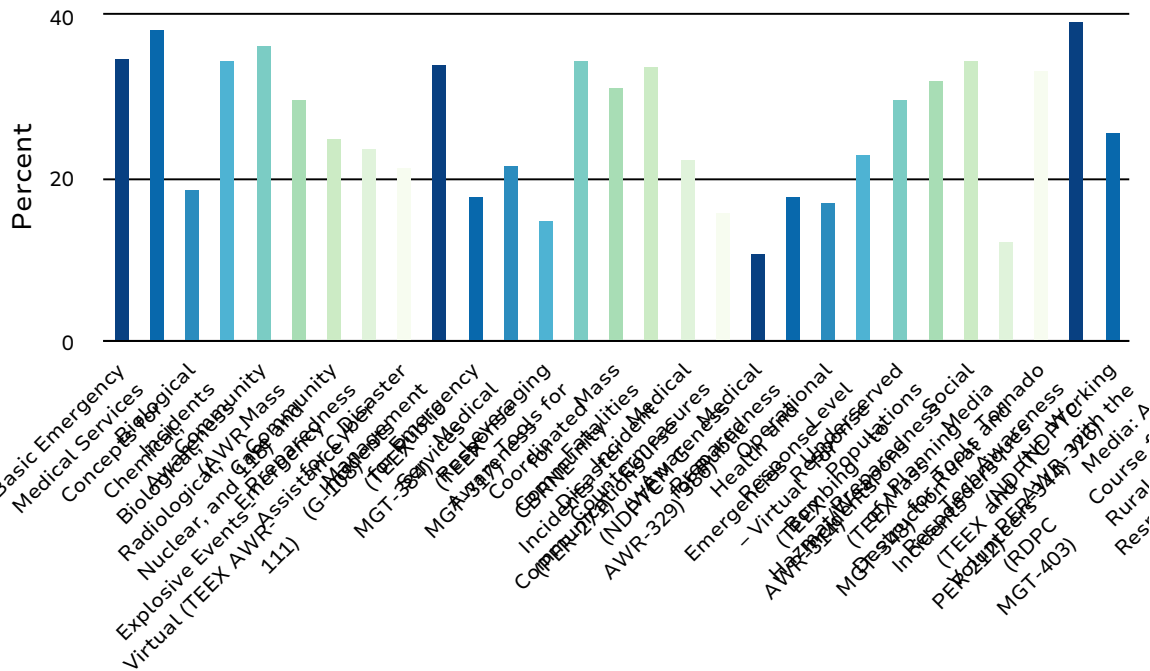

4. Which of the following health care preparedness training courses would you or someone from your organization be interested in attending, if offered? Select all that apply.























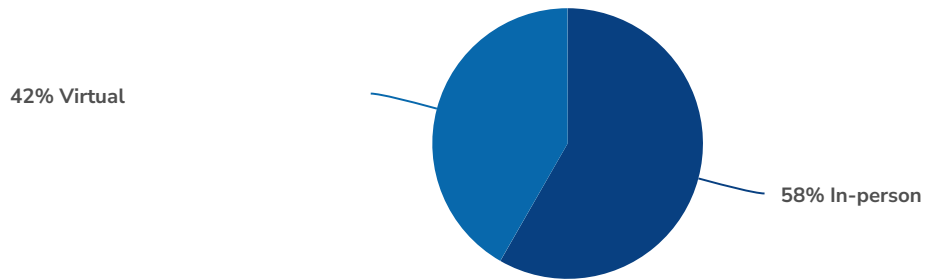

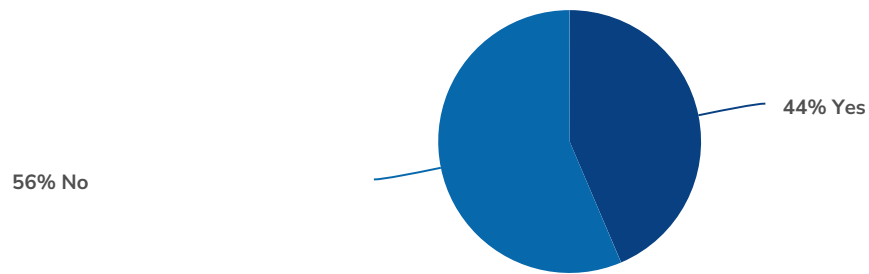
7. Would you rather have trainings offered in-person or virtually?
